

DUNWOODY FRIENDS LIBRARY CELEBRATION DAY

On Saturday, November 6, the Friends of the Dunwoody Library will hold their second annual library celebration day to raise awareness of the library in the community, encourage library use by bringing people into the building, and generally having a good time. It all starts with a welcome coffee at 10:10 AM.

At 10:30, Victor Williams of the Atlanta Audubon Society will give a talk on making a backyard habitat and attracting birds to your yard followed by Master Beekeeper, Cindy Hodges (at 11:30) talking about the importance of bees to your household. Cindy will also have a hive of live bees to show and samples of her Dunwoody- produced honey.

At 11:00 clues will be available for a family treasure hunt in and around the library facility. There will be two major prizes for those who find clues, decipher a message and find the lost symbol.

At 12:00 Atlanta book dealers Jim Strawn and Cliff Graubert will be available for two hours of free book appraisals for the public.

Meanwhile at 12:30 in the parking lot, there will be a very special car show featuring race cars, vintage cars, and a Dunwoody police car. Most will be available for guests to sit in for photos. There may also be an opportunity to fire up a couple of racing engines before the show closes at 2:30.

At 1:15 the Friends will repeat last year's popular hunt for pirate treasure for small children (up to age 5) in the courtyard. Treasures include toys and books.

Storyteller Holly Stevenson will present her one-woman play as Laura Ingalls Wilder telling of life on the prairie at 1:45 for children ages 5 to 10.

The grand finale at 3:00 PM will be a concert by noted Atlanta bluegrass group, Peachtree Station who offer traditional and contemporary bluegrass with influences from folk and rock music.

Throughout the day there will be light refreshments and a special silent auction with proceeds going to the library.

The schedule has been planned so that a person or family can participate in every activity.
